

Who We Are

The Northern Nevada Veterans Resource Center is a non-profit organization dedicated to rapidly rehousing homeless veterans and preventing veterans from becoming homeless.

As a division of the Veterans Resource Centers of America, NNVRC serves military veterans of all eras through the Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) grant.

Since opening its doors on October 1, 2012, NNVRC has assisted over 1000 veterans and their families with securing and maintaining sustainable permanent housing.

What We Do

The Northern Nevada Veterans Resource Center is able to provide a variety of assistance to military veterans and their families. Services offered include the following:

- Rental assistance
- Utility assistance
- Case management
- Assistance obtaining veteran benefits
- Community referrals for additional services, including employment, education, legal, health, childcare, food, transportation and more.

The Behavioral Health Center

The Behavioral Health Center is a 20-bed residential program providing substance abuse and mental health treatment to homeless veterans. This is a 90 day program that includes evidence based, dual-diagnosis treatment curricula such as Relapse Prevention and Cognitive-Behavioral Therapy for PTSD. Case management and AOD group process are also an integral part of our services.

In collaboration with the Crossroads program we provide on-site AA and NA groups and various life skills classes to assist in the success of permanent housing. We also provide entertainment groups like Movie Night and Game Night to develop healthy relationships and a sense of community among the residents. We do not provide detoxification, medical or services to minors or families.

The Veteran Service Officer program at the Northern Nevada Veterans Resource Center is contracted through Washoe County. The VSO is trained to assist veterans with a myriad of situations. Following are several areas that seem to top the list.

- Referrals to various agencies for help.
- Explain the SSVF program to those who may need that type of assistance.
- Help the veteran file for service connected disability.
- File various other claims for dependent compensation.
- Assist veterans to acquire proper documentation for filing claims.
- Provide various tools to the veteran i.e. – computer use to connect to the internet, telephone for local or long distance calls, resume assistance.
